## Second Sunday after the Epiphany

### January 14, 2018

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.” — Proverbs 3:5-6

Recently I saw through my den window a cloud split into several evenly spaced flat layers with each layer decreasing in length as if it were forming a stairway up into the heavens. I couldn't help thinking of it as a metaphor for our journey through life, and I pictured all of us climbing, each at a different level, reaching for help from those at the higher levels and lending our hands to those at the beginning levels. Carl Jung describes the four stages of life as thus: The Athletic Stage. Here we are preoccupied with our looks. In The Warrior Stage we are out to conquer the world, to be the best. The Statement Stage is where we look for ways to serve others and to make a difference, and finally The Stage of the Spirit, the letting go stage. Descriptions of these stages may be found on line. Just Google Carl Jung Stages of life, and click on Carl G. Jung Archetypes, the 4 Stages of Life. At what stage of life do we find ourselves, and how does each stage equip us for our ongoing journey? Perhaps this is something to think about and pray about.

## FAITH IN ACTION 2018

On **Saturday, January 27, 2018, from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm**, Grace Episcopal Church invites you to join us for an interactive workshop designed to put our faith into action with John Hennessy, Director of the Maine Episcopal Network for Justice.

In this workshop we will explore the concepts of Faith Rooted Organizing and Called to Transformation – An Asset-Based Approach to Engaging Church and Community. These are two complementary concepts that will spark your curiosity and attempt to answer your questions about the need and ability to bring your voice of faith to the public square.

We will spend time focusing on the questions, not necessarily the answers, as we discover together what our unique gifts are and how do we organize people to bring all their gifts to the table. We will discuss how to follow the Jesus who transforms the world instead of saving our souls.
